There is also a box of rejects and a box I'm not sure what to do with yet (related to creating a standard format and deciding what fits in our collection).

\*Last week I got an e-mail from Abby Blachly at LibraryThing:

Thanks for writing - I'm glad LibraryThing is working for you! First, have you used the "power edit" feature in your catalog? Click "p/e" icon with the pencil in it on the top bar of your catalog, and you'll be in "power edit" mode, which enables you to add or remove tags from multiple books at the same time.

We are, actually, considering the addition of some sort of "tag management" system, doing basically what you're looking for - making batch changes, correcting spelling, editing all instances of a tag, etc.
